A breathing space affords protections which include: pausing enforcement action and contact from creditors freezing interest and charges on debts whilst the mental health crisis lasts plus thirty days after the crisis has ended To be eligible for a breathing space an approved mental health professional (AMHP) needs to provide evidence to a debt advisor that the individual is in receipt of mental health crisis treatment for a mental disorder which is of a serious nature. Royal British Legion Everyday Needs Grant	The Royal British Legion has launched a new grant scheme for veterans and their families who are struggling to pay their energy bills. The initiative will provide non-repayable emergency grants of up to £2,400 over 12 months (£200 a month) and is available across the UK. In general, the Armed Forces community includes those who have served, or are serving, in the Royal Navy, British Army or Royal Air Force, as well as their families, dependants and carers — which can include children, current and former spouses and partners, widows and widowers. The Royal British Legion uses a broad definition of "Armed Forces community" — so even if you're not sure you fit in one of the categories above, it's worth checking your eligibility the website.
